Otherwise, what is the other option? You'll place the blame on the person that the hurt seemed to stem from. Yes, they spoke out of pride too, but pride attracts pride.

Keep your heart clean before the Lord by donning Heaven's cloak of humility to shield you from the pride of man. Pray against pride before you speak, and ask for Heaven's humility servicing to suit you up and get you to say things in a humble way, and to have your heart in the position to learn. That's humility.

You can't truly learn things without humility, for God's Spirit comes to the humble. Anything that His Spirit wouldn't want you to learn, isn't real learning. So that's why you can be of a mind to “learn” no matter what is being said or done, by anyone. You don't necessarily “learn” whatever they are wishing for you to. What I'm talking about is learning what God can use the experience to teach you—whatever His Spirit punches through to teach your heart and spirit.

Be ready to learn and eager to investigate and find out more truths, knowing how little, how very very minute a grasp you have on all that there is to know. —Along with everyone else, who are all still learning too.
