Character Trait #1: Positive Attitude

Bible Story

(True Story)

Job was a man who had more troubles in one day than you or I can imagine having! He lost all that he owned, as well as almost all those he lived with. It was very difficult for him to experience being rich, healthy, and well thought of, and then to suddenly have everything taken from him in a day.

Job learned a lot through the hard times. He learned faith and trust. He learned that even if the worst possible things were going on around him, or happening to him, that God can and will make things right in the end. He learned to pray in humility, and to hold on to God's promises.

Sometimes it helps to compare yourself with others who have a much worse situation to endure than you do. So if things seem too rough for you today, and you just can't seem to smile much, try to think about Job. He learned faith even in the midst of the hardest times. Be glad that you don't have it nearly as bad, and if you do, or if you think you do, well, if Job could make it through that difficult time, so can you!

Because of Job's faith and how he learned to trust in God's wisdom, God rewarded him with even more than he had before. How about that? Will your faith be that strong? Will you still praise God in spite of all the difficulties that you might have to face today? Then as a result, you will also gain wonderful rewards in return!

Jesus knows what you can manage and just how much you can take, and He only allows you to experience the things that will in the end help you in some way. He is a God of love, and cares so very much for you. Trust that He loves you, no matter what may be happening to you.

The prophet Habakkuk included a wonderful word of praise in his book, a promise he wrote in prayer. He wanted to praise God even if his crops didn't grow well, and he didn't have any farm animals left, and if the food he was depending on for his family wasn't available.

We are used to the idea of just going to the shop or market to get our food.—But for them back then, if their crops didn't grow, that would be the same as us saying, today "I'll praise God even if the market was all empty, and nothing was left in the shops when I needed to get food to eat."

Can we be that filled with faith in the Lord, that even when things we need the most aren't there, that we'll still trust that Him to take care of us and to work good or even better things out for us? That's positive thinking!

When you're thinking positive thoughts you're thinking that things will work out, even if it looks difficult. Jesus can help us to do this!

A Prayer

Dear Jesus,

You tell us in the Bible to think on the things that are of "good report" and "lovely" and "pure." Not everything around me is always good and great. I have a hard time enjoying some things that I often seem to be faced with. Sometimes people are unkind to me, and it takes away my smile for awhile. Sometimes a favourite item is lost or broken, or is no longer around, and it's bothersome. I get hurt or feel sick in some way, and there are lots of things that I can't do that I wish I could.

I know that everyone on Earth faces things that aren't their favourite, or even some things that are very sad or difficult. There are some people who seem to be happy and are encouraging to others, and kind-hearted no matter what is happening around them, or what they experience. I wish I could be like that, Jesus, but sometimes it just seems too hard to smile all the time.

I know I don't need to be laughing always, every second, as part of life is to experience all sorts of emotions and situations. That's just the way it is on Earth. But maybe there is one thing I can do, and that's what I'd like You to help me with. When there is something that is hard for me, I want to learn to form the habit of finding something good in it—even if there is only a tiny little part of it that isn't bad.

I want to be someone who looks for the good and thinks about the best, rather than mostly noticing the things that aren't good. If I can form that habit, then I think it will help me to not get so down about things. It's hard enough going through rough experiences, or being hurt by someone, or going without something that I need. I don't need to add to the trouble by letting myself think only about the difficulties and sad things.

If I were to make it a game to look for the good in everything—and I mean everything!—I think I would have a much happier and easier time. Things wouldn't get to me as much, and I might even be able to smile too, in spite of hardships. I can't do this on my own, Jesus. Please help me to listen to Your ideas, of what You'd like to whisper to me in those times when I need to see and think and focus on the good.

It might help me get along better with many others who I might normally have a hard time being around. If I can notice the good things about people, and not concentrate on the things that I don't like or the things that that aren't good, I think I might be able to show more of Your love, Jesus, to others by being a better friend and help.

From Jesus to Us

Imagine if ice wasn't cold—there wouldn't be anything to keep your food preserved in your freezer. If there wasn't such a thing as very cold water, snow and ice, well, things might be warmer and nicer in some too-cold places, but there are other things that wouldn't be so great, right?

There would be no ice-cream, no snowmen and snowballs, no ice-skating, no "save it for another day" perishable foods and no extra refreshing water on a very hot day.

Nearly everything that is difficult has something good about it too, that you can try to notice or discover and think about.

People are that way too. There's no person on Earth that is totally and perfectly wonderful in every way and does everything right all the time. No one does just what you want them to all the time in every situation, and never gets sick or unable to do what you need them to do. There aren't any people on Earth who never make mistakes, and who are right 100% of the time.

If there is someone who is making things very hard for you or who has hurt you in some way, or has taken something of yours, or accidentally broke something special of yours, or has done things that aren't to your liking, try to look for the good in them.

Maybe not everything is good and perfect, but it won't help you to be any happier if you fill your mind with only the things about them that you don't like.

It might be hard, and it might take some positive thinking and praying to be able to see past those "rocks" in the way. But if you can move those away from your mind, you might see something that

gives you a new appreciation for them.

Did someone take a certain item of yours without asking, and then lose it, so they were then unable to return it? Ouch! That can really hurt, and be pretty difficult to forgive and to see past. However, think for a moment. Have they done just that, constantly, again and again? Most likely not.

Are they usually the first one to jump in and help when a job needs to be done? Or do they have a nice voice, and enjoy singing?

Or perhaps they don't have a brother or sister or a close friend like you do, and are lonely, and instead of your item that they borrowed, they would have gladly had you to talk with and laugh together with.

Everyone has something good in them, and good things that they try to do, or that they did do before.

Maybe there are things that are making it nearly impossible for them, at the present time, to act their best. Maybe they are having difficulties that you don't know about, and things are easier for you in some ways. Maybe it's time for you to jump in and be the first person today to help them smile. It could change their life or yours too, if they start to be a friend to you instead.

However, it's hard to speak kindly to or smile at someone, unless in your heart and mind you are trying to see the good, notice the best, find the good qualities, and imagine what great things they can and will do if you give them encouragement.

Your positive reactions, actions and words to others will begin by your having positive thoughts about them, first of all. What you think will affect more than just your life, but each and everyone you come in contact with. Guard your mind. Look for the good and focus on it.

Character Trait #2: Patience/Longsuffering

Patience is Rewarded

(True Story)

Have you ever waited for something you wanted for a long time? Maybe you waited for a few weeks, or months, or even years. Some people wait nearly their whole life for something they are really looking forward to enjoying.

Abraham was a hundred years old when what he had been waiting to have for so long was finally given to him. At long last he and his wife Sarah, had a little boy—the baby God said He'd give to them. Talking to God about his heart's wish and believing God's words helped him to be patient. He also kept busy in the meantime with all the other things God wanted them to be doing. It helped them to not give up hope or get upset about how long it seemed to be taking.

Simeon was another very old man, who was waiting for a special baby. It wasn't a child for himself and his wife that he was waiting for. God promised Simeon that he'd get to see Jesus, God's only son, the Saviour of the world. He was very old when it finally happened. One day Joseph and Mary and baby Jesus came into the temple. God told Simeon that the baby they held was God's Son, the Messiah. At long last Simeon's wish and desire had come true. He was glad he'd waited. It took time, but it felt wonderful when it finally happened.

Anna was a very old woman, who had also waited so very long to see Jesus, God's son, on Earth. That same day, she also saw Him, held in Mary's arms, and knew at last she'd gotten to see Who she'd been longing to see. Salvation had come to Earth.

In the Book of Proverbs it says, "When the desire cometh, it is a tree of life." (Proverbs 13:12) Sometimes the best things take a long time to become a reality, but when at last the time is right, we're so glad we waited, and didn't give up hope.

A Prayer

Dear Jesus,

Sometimes it's so hard to wait. I have to wait for so many things. I have to wait for a turn. I have to wait to grow older. I have to wait for permission to do certain things. I have to wait for coming events. Even waiting for my birthday takes so very long. I just wish I could have everything right at the time when I feel like I most want it.

I know that learning to wait can teach me to have patience, and patience will help make me a wiser and more able adult, able to do things I couldn't do if I wasn't patient. Being a good driver, for example, requires me to wait for the light to change, to wait in traffic, to wait for my turn to safely go. If I don't learn to wait now, while I'm younger, I won't make a good driver, or a very skilled person when I am older.

I need You to help me, Jesus. I get upset and grumpy, and I grumble at times. I just can't seem to wait patiently sometimes for the best things. I feel I want everything right away. Please help me to learn this important trait—to wait, and to have faith while doing so.

You take care of me so well, and I know that I can trust that everything is in Your hands. I am Your child, and I know You love me, and will give me just what I need when the time is right—as I pray, have faith and trust You for it. And in the meantime, You are giving me other good things that I really need—like patience, which is so important to have.

Thank You for the opportunities to exercise it and strengthen it. I know that I as trust you, Jesus, for all things, that patience will come more easily.

From Jesus to Us

Has there ever been something that you really wanted so much that you had a hard time waiting for it? You thought about it, dreamed about it, and couldn't stop talking about it with your friends? It can be so hard to wait.

That's not the only time you need patience. There are other times, when what you want isn't just a thing or an event, but when you have the urge to say something, or to act in a certain way, and it isn't the best thing at the time to do or say, and might make things harder for others, or even for yourself. These are also times to exercise patience—to wait for the right time to say or do what you are feeling, or to wait till the feeling passes, if it's something that should not be acted on—like anger, or wanting something for yourself that is not best for you to have then.

There are lots of times when patience is just what is needed, rather than the satisfaction of having what you're wanting. And it's hard! It can feel like it's one of the hardest things to do at the time. It's

a difficult skill to learn because it means giving up or going without what you might be wanting, or wishing to have right then and there—whether it's something you can touch and hold, or see and experience, or something of the heart that you want to feel.

It takes great strength of character to wait, to told your tongue, or go without for a while, to bear with the actions and words of others and not get upset, to listen to others' thoughts and feelings before saying your own, to see something of yours get lost or broken accidentally by others and take it calmly, to not feel you have to be always on the go, but can sit and relax when you have to wait. These are a few examples of exercising patience.

So why would anyone want to be patient? What are the consequences of not waiting or keeping control of your temper, words, actions and wishes? The end result is that you miss out on the things that you most want.

Imagine a pilot learning to fly an airplane. He might just want to get to the fun part real quickly, to finally be up in the air. But if he doesn't take the time to study and learn about all the gauges and dials, to get to know all it takes to fly the plane safely, how to deal with weather conditions, how to land, and all that he needs to know, he won't be prepared or skilled enough to do the job, and things won't go well.

If you want to have friends, and enjoy fun times together, it may not happen if you aren't able to wait for your turn. To have fun with others you'll also need to learn to be tolerant of others' mistakes and to forgive their blunders or the times things aren't just the way you'd like them to be. It works well to patiently wait to say what you are feeling, until it's the right time, and to say it in a kind way.

Learning patience is hard, and comes through having times of not getting all you want at just the time you want to have it. But when you learn to be a patient person you've learned something very important that will benefit you and others so much.

Character Trait #3: Honesty/Openness

Talking about Feelings

While living in the Garden of Eden, Adam and Eve had a hard time being honest when they had disobeyed God. The Lord would walk and talk with them in the garden. But after they did what they knew was wrong, it was hard for them to be honest and to talk with Jesus. They felt like hiding. (Genesis 3) Jesus loved them so much, and missed being with them. That's why He then came to Earth, to make things all right again, to be with us, to pay the price to forgive all people's wrong doings. The Bible says, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins." (1 John 1:9) We can always talk with Him about what happens, whether it's a careless mistake or a wrong that we've done.

We know God loves us, but sometimes we aren't so sure that others will love us as much as God does, and we wonder what they will say or think if we tell them the truth about something. However, if it's something that should be said, and needs to be said to make things right again, then the Lord will help

things to go better than if we were to hold it in and not say anything. We can get help when we talk about the things that need to be said.

King David often had things on his heart that he wanted to talk with the Lord about, and he wrote down many of his prayers. These are compiled in the Book of Psalms. One time he wrote, "I acknowledge my sin unto thee, and mine iniquity have I not hid. I said, I will confess my transgressions unto the Lord; and thou forgavest the iniquity of my sin." (Psalm 32:5)

When he had done something that wasn't right, and was sorry for it, he wanted his heart to be clean again. It can feel uncomfortable and like your heart is dirty if you have something you haven't been honest about. So, it helps to do like King David did, and talk with Jesus about it, asking Him to forgive you and to show you if there's anyone else you should be honest with, and what to say about it.

Sometimes it can feel so very scary to think about telling someone something—whether it's about what you did that wasn't right, or even you giving someone else a suggestion of a way they could improve their behaviour, or explaining that they have made you feel bad by their words or actions.

The Book of Psalms has many words and thoughts from King David's heart. He was a man that went through a lot of things. He'd made plenty of mistakes and experienced many different emotions and feelings, as well as sickness and pain. He faced many challenges and had lots of struggles in his life. David talked to the Lord in prayer and with words of praise during his times of difficulty, and found peace and encouragement when he did. Many of these words of communion with the Lord are written down, and now we can benefit from these words too. It helps to read from the Book of Psalms when you are feeling difficult emotions and facing hard situations and don't know who to go to or talk with. When you talk to Jesus first of all, as King David did, and you get His thoughts and instructions on what to do next in order to make things right between you and others, it helps give you faith.

A Prayer

Jesus, Your Word says, "Let the words of my mouth be acceptable in Thy sight", and I want my words to please You. Sometimes it's just really hard to say things that make me look less than perfect. I want people to see, and think, and say good things about me. I want to have good feelings in my heart, but I don't always.

I'm always making mistakes. I know it will make things easier on me and others, and make things better if I admit, apologize, explain, tell, confess, or whatever I need to do when I get these feelings and thoughts in my mind and heart.

I need You to help me to know the words to say, to show me the right time to say things, and to say them to the right people too. Thank you for being my true Friend, Who loves me no matter what. You're the best!

From Jesus to Us

There are so many reasons why it's hard to say what you are thinking, or to tell others about something you've done. Mostly it's because you are afraid of something happening that you don't want to happen. Just remember the verse that says, "All things work together for good to them that love the Lord." That means that if you love Me, and if you are saying and doing something because

you think it's what I tell you in My Word is right, then the end result will be far better than if you hold back and are afraid to be honest.

I can make even the most difficult things easy. Pray, obey and say! There's a good motto. Pray for Me to help you to know what is the right thing to do or say when you feel something in your heart, or something goes wrong. Do what you think is right or that I'm showing you to do. Say the words you need to, in the way that is best—a loving, honest way.

Another time to be open and honest with others is when you need prayer. If things are getting too hard for you, or you keep getting the wrong ideas from the Enemy, or you are feeling bad feelings towards others, or you aren't feeling well, just be honest and ask someone who will understand to pray for you. James wrote in his book, "Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much." (James 5:16)

Admitting to others that you need My help, and joining together in prayer brings much faster results than if you were to just keep trying on your own to make things better in your heart and mind. It's just part of being in the world (ever since Adam and Eve sinned in the Garden of Eden) that people will get tempted to give in to thoughts and ideas from the Enemy. But listening to Me and talking to Me about it, and getting good advice from the right people is sure to bring good things your way.

Be open, be honest with Me and with the kind of people who can help you, and it will bring good fruits and faster victory your way. Try it!

Character Trait #4: Communicative/Expressive

Language is like the joints that keep the bones of a body moving and working together to do something—like walking, running, playing ball games, carrying something, and dancing. These are all things that require several bones moving and working together.

When you can talk together with others, and understand what needs to get done, and explain things to each other, or ask questions or give answers, you can then get things done. If a team of people gathered together in a room, and no one could talk, or read, or understand anything that others were trying to say, it would be impossible for them to invent something new and work together to build it. Ideas couldn't be expressed, questions couldn't be answered, and jobs couldn't be divided among them all.

That's a bit what it was like sometime after Noah and his team had made it safely through the flood, and the world was getting populated again. Since everyone spoke the same language they could all understand what everyone was saying. However, what they were getting into doing wasn't pleasing the Lord. They were entertaining very proud thoughts, and came up with a project of building the tallest tower they could—in order to be as great as God. It was not a good idea. Teamwork and unity are good, but if there is only one team in the whole world, and everyone is compelled to do the same thing, then that doesn't leave much room for variety, new inventions, and new ideas, and people can't learn new things.

God then gave new languages to people. The work on the tower of Babel came to a halt as each person adjusted to the change—that their personal family were the only ones that could understand what they were saying. There was confusion with so many people speaking different languages and being unable to understand what others were saying. God used this as His way of correcting them for

perusing their proud plans. People left the work site and area, and moved to new places with their families.

Communication can bring success to projects, jobs, ideas and work. –Whereas the lack of it can make things pretty difficult, or impossible. In this case it was a good thing that the project came to a stop. However, if the Lord shows you something good to do together with others, talking about things and understanding what each other is trying to express will make things work better, and go more easily.

A Prayer

I want to learn how to be a better communicator. I have a hard time expressing my thoughts and feelings, and I don't feel confident that others even want to hear what I have to say. I feel bad when my thoughts and feelings aren't treated with kindness when I do try to say things. This makes me want to close up and not say things. That doesn't really help, though, as then I get all bottled up and feel like I don't have a friend, or that people don't like me, and then things start to bother me even more.

Please help me to know when to speak, and to know what to say. I know I don't have to—nor is it even wise—to always speak whatever is on my mind and heart. Learning to wait for the right time, and learning to say things in the right way is a good skill. But even if I can't get it right every time, help me to have the boldness and the faith to just try to say things anyway, to communicate, to express the things I feel, in the best way I can.

Your Word says, "Forget not to communicate," and that it pleases You when we do. (Hebrews 13:16) Help me to make it a daily part of my life, to talk, to listen, or write notes, or in some way to say what I'm feeling, and to find out what others have to say too. I know it's a two-way street. I need to do better at listening to others. Please help me to have the love and concern that I need to listen more.

I guess I can just start with You, Jesus. You are someone I can talk with about anything, and anytime, and You always understand. Maybe if I practice saying things to You often throughout the day, and get used to hearing You speaking to me as well, it will help me in my interactions with others.

I'm so glad You can help me to take the steps I need to, one day at a time, to grow in this skill of communication. I want to be like it says in the Book of Isaiah, "The Lord God hath given me the tongue of the learned, that I should know how to speak a word in season to him that is weary." (Isaiah 50:4)

From Jesus to Us

Language and communication are like bridges that bring people together. To know what's on people's minds, and for them to be able to help answer your questions, you usually need to put things into words—and use words that accurately describe what you are trying to express.

Sometimes you feel upset, or sad, or are bothered by what someone does, and choose to use other ways to express how it is making you feel. However, using things like acting roughly, doing unkind things, feeling and acting very sad, making comments that make others feel bad, getting angry, or just not wanting to talk to others doesn't help to make things feel right and friendly again.

Most of the time others don't even know that you are feeling bad about things, or are hurt inside, or that you don't understand why they did something. So if you express your thoughts in words, and

explain how it's made you feel, and what you'd like them to do or to change in, you may be pleasantly surprised how much easier things get from taking that step of communication.

If you know what someone else was thinking and feeling and why they did what they did it helps you understand them better, and it's easier to then be forgiving and tolerant. So besides explaining what you feel, asking others to explain things when they are ready to talk about it, can help to smooth things over. It can prevent misunderstandings and difficult times that a lack of communication brings.

There are many reasons that make people do and say things in certain ways, and you can never accurately guess just what all the reasons are. If you wonder, or if something has rubbed you the wrong way, you might want to ask them about it, and express how it's made you feel. They also can't guess what you are feeling and the way their actions or words have affected you. When there is a deeper and better understanding between you and others then you can have a lot more fun, and there is less guessing about what you and they are thinking and feeling.

Remember, it helps to think before you speak. Think first, "Is what I want to say true, kind, and necessary—helping to make things better in some way?" Stopping to pause and think about this will help to prevent you saying things that you may wish you hadn't—words that you will need to apologize for later. Not that that's bad, on the contrary, apologizing is a good thing.

It's part of important communication. But the fact that someone feels badly about what's been said is what you and others want to minimize and avoid of course.

A good Bible verse to remember is: "She openeth her mouth with wisdom; and in her tongue is the law of kindness." (Proverbs 31 26)

Character Trait #5: Undaunted by challenges/Tackling difficulties with faith

(True Story)

When there is a huge job to do, and you seem to be the main one who needs to do it, what do you need to have? Of course you need the tools and materials and all that you physically need to use to get it done. But what are the tools of your heart and mind, the spiritual materials that are necessary to help you get it done?

You need a vision, an idea of the way it should be, and the way you want it to be. You also need faith that somehow, with you and the Lord working as a team, and with others helping all they can, that you can do it. Maybe not completely on your own, but you know that through prayer and God's wonderful assistance, you will be victorious.

Another thing that helps is if you have the courage and initiative to just start. It's hard to get started, but once you do, and you begin to see progress it gets the momentum going, and things get moving and easier in some ways as you go along —unless something or someone is trying to stop you, like Nehemiah encountered.

Nehemiah decided to tackle an enormous task. He wanted there to be a tall, wide and strong wall, not on a house or a building, but around an entire city. Now that's a big job. The old wall was broken, and he felt God calling him to be the one to help fix it. He wasn't, however, the only one around to rebuild it. He asked others who wanted to see this job completed as well to work with him. So together he and his team got to work, and day after day put in long and hard hours working.

If everyone else around town had been supportive of this project it would have gotten done even faster. There were however some people who just didn't want there to be a wall around the city. They tried all they could to get Nehemiah and the hard working team of men to stop their work, or to be slowed down at least.

Nehemiah was not one to give up or to quit when things were tough. He knew in his heart that the job was one worth finishing. He knew it was what God had asked him to do. He wasn't about to stop just because a few people didn't like it. Nehemiah just kept on, and didn't quit no matter what others said or did to stop them.

In the end the wall was built, and there was great joy and rejoicing! He then had the hard job of helping the people to also follow in the Lord's ways, and to start making it a good city, filled with people who wanted to behave according to God's rules and to be motivated to do what was right.

Many people benefited from his bravery, courage, initiative and persistence. There was nothing easy or particularly fun about the jobs he needed to do. However, it gave his heart a sense of satisfaction and fulfilment to see the job getting done. When his work there was done he was so glad that he hadn't given up, but had worked hard and persevered.

What kinds of things make you want to quit when you are faced with a difficult job, but you are the one who can do it best or whose turn it is to help out? Think of the end results, and don't give up until you reach your goal. If it's something that Jesus has commissioned you to, and told you to do, then you can be sure that you'll be much better off, and have a much happier time in the end if you'll just get to it and push through until the job is complete.

A Prayer

Dear Jesus,

I'm so glad that I can always turn to You, and that You are able to help me, no matter what situation I find myself in, or what troubles may come my way.

Your Word says, "I can do all things through Christ which strengthens me." (Philippians 4:13) So even if something is too hard for me, it is never too hard for You to help and bring a solution.

I'm praying now to ask You for Your strength. There are some things that I need to do that just seem too hard, and like they will take too long to do. I wish I was skilled enough to be able to do anything that needs to be done, and for it to be easy and fast for me to do it. —I might be well thought of by everyone then! I just can't do everything, though, and there are others that seem better at some things than I, so it takes more effort and work for me.

Please give me the courage, the faith, and the perseverance to do what I need to do. With You by my side, helping me, I know I can do it. Any problem is easy for You. I'm so glad to have You as My friend, and to know that You are with me day and night. You never leave just because things are hard or unpleasant or difficult. In fact, You are even closer to me at those times, when I call for You and I need Your help.

From Jesus to Us

Did you know that I had countless troubles and difficulties when I was on Earth? Things were not easy for Me just because I was the Saviour of the world. Who I was didn't mean that I could live a life free

of any hardships and "road blocks" and things that were hard for Me and My disciples.

That is because it was one of My reasons for coming to Earth in the first place. I wanted to experience what sorts of difficulties people have on Earth, and to be able to help them. Face challenges and hard times with a bit of a smile, thinking, "Here's an opportunity to learn something—and to help make a difference!" Then you won't feel weighed down with the discouragement that problems and troubles often bring to those who are looking only at the bad, and not at the good that can and will come to those who face it bravely.

So smile in the face of hard times. They won't last forever—and can only get better if you pray, and think about the good in it, and do your best to improve the situation. Tell Me about it if things are tough for you. Together you and I can change anything you encounter for the better.

Character Trait #6: Intrigued and interested in life/Full of vigour, zest, and not giving place to boredom

(True Story)

Paul (or Saul as he was also called) was a man that wasn't going to waste time sitting around wondering why he was bored, and thinking that there wasn't much to do.

He thought whatever he believed was good enough for the whole world to know! When Jesus appeared to him, telling him the truth and setting him straight on a few things, pointing Paul in the right direction, it was enough for Paul to get moving.

Since Jesus was real, then what was he waiting for? Paul was determined to tell as many people about Jesus as he possibly could, in the shortest amount of time.

Once he had the vision and the goal of what he wanted to do with his life, this propelled him onward. Find out first from the Lord what you can do, since He knows what is truly best for you and others. Then get busy and have fun doing it, with all your heart, mind and strength.

Life will be a thrill then, like it is meant to be! You won't be here on Earth forever, and time ticks on by quickly. What are you using your time for?

When your life is coming to a close, and you are thinking back on all that you did, I hope you will make the choices now that will please you and Jesus, as you ponder things then. You don't want to just keep wasting time, and you are starting to get that not-so-pleasant feeling of boredom, so you get thinking of something to do. You decide to make a miniature village out of cardboard, and bits of this and that. Well, you have the idea, and that's a great start. Next, you need to have a reason to do it. In this case it's because you don't have much else to do, and don't want to just be sitting around doing nothing. But besides that, you want to learn something artistic. It will be a great learning experience. You also decide how fun it will be to use your little Lego men there, and it will be something fun to show to your parents. So those are your reasons.

Once you get started it kind of gets you in the gear of doing things, and that's when it's easy to get distracted doing other things as well—whatever pops into your mind, or whatever you see someone else starting to do. That's when you have to decide if it's something that you want to finish, and to reach your goal. You'll feel good that you stuck to it and are then able to enjoy the end result.

Ideas, doing them, working, learning through it, sticking to it, and getting to enjoy the results can make each day a fun experience!

Character Trait #7: Desire Godly ways/Respect and reverence the Lord/Stay on His channel Bible Story

The story of Noah and how the world was washed and given a fresh start shows the importance of choosing to do things God's way. It's like a person who has made a neat new invention. He's put a lot of work into it and planned every detail. When at last it's complete there's one more important thing to do before he gives it to someone else to use for a while—he needs to give instructions on its use and make a "user's manual." So he does that, and makes it very clear just how to operate his machine and how to use it in the best and safest ways—and how not to ruin it or get hurt while using it.

However, if the person he gives all the instructions to doesn't read them, and doesn't follow them, the machine really won't last long and won't be able to be used for the purpose it was created. The one who worked so skilfully to make it will feel sad and upset.

The Earth is God's creation, and lots of love, time, thought and creating went into it. But if humans won't read or listen to or follow any of His instructions for how to enjoy and care for the world and each other properly, and they don't remember or obey His words and instead start doing it their own way, things will get into a mess—like they have.

At the time of Noah things were already very messed up, mixed up, and nothing good was coming from the wonderful creation that God had made. It was time to clean things up and give out the instructions once again, to people who would listen and obey. Noah was someone who would listen and would follow whatever God said, so he and his family were the only ones permitted to keep using God's invention—the world.

The Bible says that things will continue to get bad again, until it's like it was at the time of Noah, because the people who then began to live on the cleaned-up world tossed aside the manual and stopped asking the creator about how to operate and use His Earth-invention wisely, and were always trying to do things opposite to His ways.

Yes, He will—one of these days, in His own special way that He knows will be best. There won't be another flood of water again, as He promised to not do that again. If so, then you'll make Him so happy, and you'll have a wonderful future with Him, and will enjoy seeing how nice the world will be one day, when the time is right.

A Prayer

Magazines and advertisements also show pictures that display something that is unpleasant. From Jesus to Us

Have you ever tried pouring a big glass of juice or milk, but you aimed wrong or were going too fast and the cup tipped over and the drink spilled all over the table and on to the floor as well? A glass of refreshing cold juice or milk would have been nice, but in the wrong place—on the table or floor—it was then just a mess to clean up. It would get stinky, sticky and be slippery and dangerous too if you didn't clean it up. Instead of something nice it was just a bunch of hard work to get things fixed up again.

That's like words and actions—at the right time, in the right place, and doing it in the right way it can be great and just what is needed. But if you aren't aiming your thoughts right, and you aren't doing things in a thoughtful way, or you're being careless about the effects of what you are doing, then it can end up making a mess of things.

Take kite flying as another example. You have to have the string nice and long and strong and straight. The kite needs to not be torn with a large hole in it. The tail needs to be freely flying in the right direction to be of any help to the kite. And of course, you need to be trying to fly it at the right time when the wind is blowing just the right amount for the kite to even fly at all.

If you just went out on any kind of day, wind or not, and took any old broken kite that had parts missing and was tangled it really wouldn't work well, and wouldn't be fun at all. You'd be doing a lot of running trying to get it to fly. It might be good for exercise but the goal you are trying to reach wouldn't happen.

So when you are doing things, you need to stop and pray, and stop to think: "Is everything that I need here? Do I have the right materials? Is this even the right time to be doing this activity at all? Am I doing things in a safe way? Will it bring the results that I'm hoping for? Is it what the Lord wants me to be doing right now? Will it make Jesus and others happy? —Or is it just some crazy plan that I'm trying to make work, but it won't be the best?"

I want you and others to be safe and happy and getting to know Me better. When you are doing things My way—I, Who made you and the world around you, and Who knows the past and the future and just what is going on in the present—then I can make things turn out for your good in the end, and you'll learn helpful things along the way too.

So stop to think, stop to pause, stop to pray, and you'll get better results from the things you attempt to do. Being wise means to put into effect the things you have learned and the knowledge you have gained to bring about good results and to make things go well for you and others. It means not just doing whatever you happen to think of but to do as is best—and as I have taught you or will continue to teach you, is truly the best thing.

Sometimes you have to just do what I've said in My Word is right, before you've learned for yourself that it's really the best—because you aren't old enough to have experienced the troubles that would come if you did things the opposite way. But if you do what I say to do anyway, then things will go much better for you than if you just were to do any old thing that others are doing or saying to do, or just doing whatever comes to mind.

There is a right way and a wrong way—and usually the easy way isn't the best way. But the right way is simply My way and what I want you to do at the time, and in the end that will prove to be the best and what makes you the happiest.

If others are foolishly saying to do this or that, yet in your heart you know it's not something I would have liked to do or to watch or to listen to if I was there, and if it's not a safe idea or good in anyway, then don't do it. Even if it's hard to do things differently than what it seems others are doing, and they might even make you feel bad or pressure you to do this or that, in the end you'll have it better, and be happier and wiser if you choose to do what I know is good and lovely, true, just and honest and all those great things listed in Philippians 4:8.

"Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things." (Philippians 4:8)

A Message from Jesus about respecting His Spirit and staying on His Channel:

My dear little ones, do you remember how I told My disciples to be wise as serpents and harmless as doves? Perhaps you thought that was an unusual parallel but I was trying to tell them the importance

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Character Trait #8: Enjoy Nature

Bible Story

(True Story)

Jesus often talked of nature while speaking to the many who came to hear Him. Many of the stories He told and the examples He gave were about things of nature. When He was asked where He lived, He explained that He didn't have a house to go to then and He spoke of the animals

each having a habitat or nest—unlike Him, who was travelling around helping people.

To give an example to everyone of what it means to have faith and to trust that God will care for us and give us what we need, Jesus talked about the beauty of the flowers, and spoke of the

birds receiving the food they needed by God's provision.

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Jesus talked of spring and the leaves growing on the trees being a sign of summer getting closer—just like there will be signs in the way things are in the world, that will show us that Jesus' return is getting closer.

Then there was the "Parable of the Sower" that Jesus told, to show how God's Word in our hearts can bring about good things in our lives—like the good crops that grow in good soil, bringing forth plentiful fruit and produce. He spoke of the rocks, different types of plants, the sun and the birds.

Jesus talked about the weather. Rainstorms and flooding around the wise and foolish man's houses was like the troubles of life, and only those that do what He tells us to do will remain strong. He spoke of the colourful clouds in the sky being signs to give clues about what the weather will be like, and reminding us to keep a look out for the "signs of the times."
