
Here's a peek into the week when God created the world.

First He created the light.


"Let there be light", He said, and then there was light!

He separated the water, leaving some below on the Earth, and placing some way up above.





It was a lovely place!




God made some lights in the sky, so the Earth could have what it needs.

He created the sun to shine and light up the day, and the moon to shine at night. The sun helps plants to grow and keeps the Earth warm.




God also added stars and planets in the space surrounding the Earth—a whole universe!

God created and placed everything just right so that Earth would be a great place to live.




God put fish and sea creatures in the oceans and rivers, lakes and ponds.

He made birds that can travel through the sky, on land, and on the water's surface. He made birds that build their nests in trees, and birds that sing.




Then land animals, both large and small, began to explore the new world God had made.

Some had feathers, some had fur, some had scales, some had skin, some had shells, and some had wings. God liked them all, and they were all friendly and happy animals.




The world was a beautiful place to be, and ready for the first human beings.

God then used some soil from the ground to do the most amazing thing. Out of the dirt He made a man!




Then He breathed life into him. The first man's name was Adam.

God loved Adam! He then gave Adam a fun job to do—to choose what each animal should be called. Adam named all the animals.




He liked his new animal friends, but he was also lonely, as he was the only person on Earth.

Adam wished for a friend, a person he could live with and talk to, and love—someone made like him.




God knew he needed a friend, a person to live with, talk to, and to be a companion for him.

So after putting Adam to sleep, God prepared a special friend for him.




When Adam woke up, he saw what God had made—a woman!

Adam was very happy. He loved her and called her "Eve". She was the world's very first woman.




God liked watching all the neat and cool things that His creation could do! He could see the people running and exploring a new area they had just discovered, and a bright-coloured bug finding its way across the grass.




God saw the funny animals at play, the birds in the trees and sky, singing their songs.

He gazed at the colourful display in the sky at sunset, and at all the beautiful types of flowers. It was so much fun for Him.




God saw all that He'd made, and said it was good! God took time to stop and look and listen and enjoy it all. He took a day to rest.

We can and should do the same—take time to rest, to talk with God, to enjoy nature, to laugh.




