

Then when Jesus knows we have learned our lesson, He might give us a way to get back what we lost.

Diligence

Being diligent means to do things like:

Whenever you see there is a need, do whatever you can do to help.






Safety with Prayer

Firemen



God said, "Let there be light!" and there was light.


Then God put some water on the land and some in the sky.

Changes are good for us. They teach us how much we need Jesus. They make us appreciate that Jesus is always with us. He never changes.

Lots of things change as we grow up. For example, when I was young I rode a tricycle, but now that I am older I can ride a big bicycle. That is one thing we can be sure of in our lives—that things will change.



There are some things we wish could always be the same, and sometimes changes can be difficult, when it's something that we want to always stay one certain way. But God likes for us to do new things all the time. It keeps us fresh and alive, and learning new things.

If people never changed and made new inventions we would never have computers, cars, electric lights, indoor bathrooms, telephones or many of the things that are used today.

Maybe you will get a new idea today, and if it's the Lord's plan and His idea, it will be better than the old way.

Jesus never changes. Like this verse, "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, today and forever."

That means we can count on Him doing what He said He would do. He'll always keep His promises and He'll always love us.

- Remember the words of Jesus Christ.


Trusting Jesus

If things are not going well, maybe it's best to pause and take time to talk to Jesus about it. Trusting in Jesus to help you is like resting on a big comfortable bed.






Be an Example
