The missionary replied,


"It's a miracle! You prayed with me and God answered your prayer! If you give to God, you're going to get His blessings!"


The only time this well water was clear before was during the rainy season. Yet now, when it hadn't rained for months, in answer to prayer, the well was filled with clear water.


However, the boy was so sure he was healed, that he kept insisting. At last his uncle and father agreed to take them off, so as to prove to the boy that it was not yet healed.

I didn't hear anything about it until a week later. My friend told me that someone else who had rode in that car later that day, had found it, even though we hadn't seen it when we looked earlier.


Jesus did such a sweet, caring thing for her.

When the repairman looked at the sewing machine he said that there was a part missing off the tension knob, and that it was totally impossible to use the machine without it!


Yet, through the power of prayer it had worked anyway—for two weeks, during that time when they really needed it to.

He thanked the old man and took the apple, whereupon he smiled, turned around and disappeared in the crowd!


They were both thrilled to see God perform this miracle and answer prayer in such a way.
