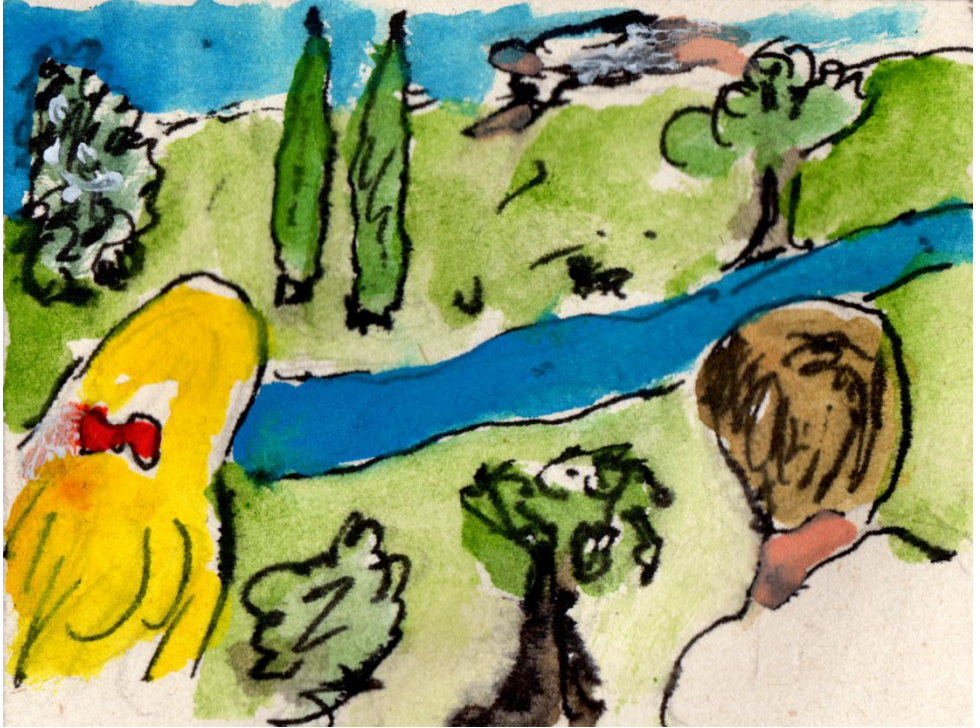

She is part of His family, and is waiting until the rest of her family can come to be with her there too.

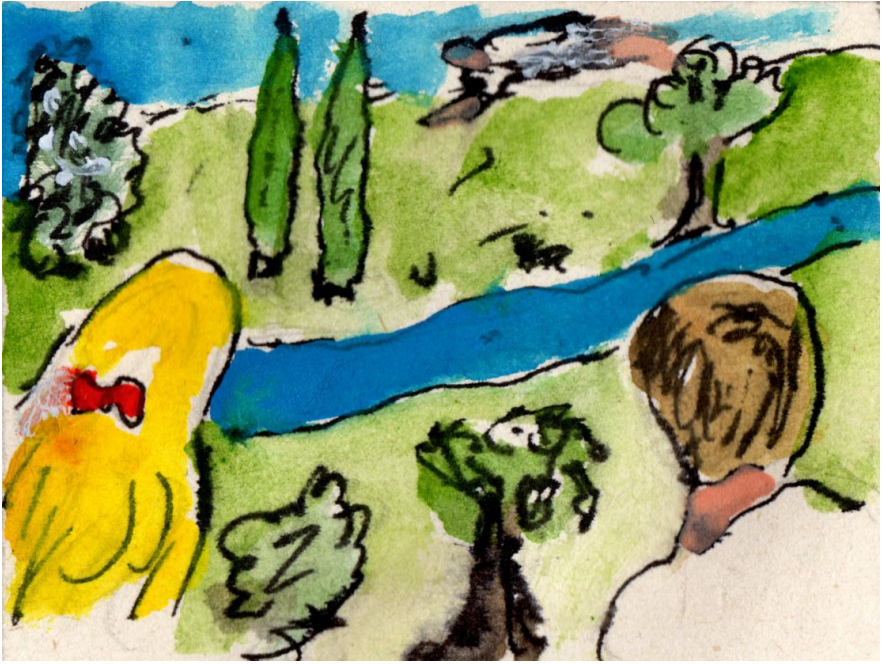
Colton also met his great-grandpa who had gone to Heaven long before.
