Would you like to know how the world began? God wanted to make a planet—Earth—and place on it some very special creations. You, and other people too!

But it needed to be made just right, so you and others could live on it and enjoy all the amazing things He wanted to fill it with.



God is an amazing guy and He's got a lot of love too, more than you can even imagine!

Everything He does comes from His heart of love—for a loving reason.

When He decides to make something, all it takes is for Him to give the word, and things happen.

God said, "Let there be light", and there was light! Next He made air and the sky—because we'd need that on our planet to survive.

He divided the water, and put some down below on the Earth and some high up above too.

He then decorated the whole Earth with beautiful and useful plants and trees, grass, flowers, and all sorts of things that grow, and things that you can eat.

Each plant had seeds too, so more and more would grow, and the Earth would be filled with beauty and all that was needed.

Activity

*Use mud on a tray or a sandbox to form hills, valleys, mountains, islands, plains and so forth. Sprinkle some grass to create the plains, and stick in small twigs with leaves to create the trees.





The first part of the story starts with My very first friends on Earth. Can you imagine a time when the Earth had only two people on it? Well, even before that, there weren't any at all! Let Me tell you about it.

Before people were made and began living on Earth, it was a mass of nothing. Nothing but darkness and water, but that was going to change, and in only one week's time

it was a thriving, beautiful planet.

God made the world, the sky, and then, to fill them, He created everything else. With just the word of His mouth, everything was formed. He took six days to make the planet we are on, as well as the surrounding stars, planets and Sun which contribute to life on Earth.

What do you think was the first thing that God created? What makes things grow and brings beauty? Light! God said, "Let there be light!" and that was all it took. Right then and there, light was created.

So, on the first day of His creation project He made light, and all the amazing aspects of light. Light makes it possible for people to see colour, it gives energy and helps things grow, and there are many other things light can do.



God, of course, doesn't need it in order to look around; the Bible says He can see in the light and in the dark (Psalm 139:12). It's not as if He had to turn on a light in order to see what He was doing, but God loves light! He's called "the Father of lights" (James 1:17). Wherever He is, in whatever He's doing, He brings light.

On the second day of the world's creation, another very important thing was made—air! Air to breathe, the atmosphere, the sky. God put a layer of air all around the world. He divided the water and put some down on the Earth, and a layer of water way up above the atmosphere or firmament, as it was called.

On the third day things really started to get fun, because that's when Earth started to take shape—like the way you do with a big mud pie, or Play-Dough! God formed the land, the islands, the mountains; He chose where to put seas and oceans, and where to place the continents, and what shape the land should have.

He didn't just leave it all brown, though. God turned it into the most amazing art project! He added new beauty to the planet, covering it and decorating it with plants, trees, flowers, bushes, vines, grass, waterfalls, trickling streams, forests, meadows, beaches, grassy hills, orchards, and on and on.

Of course, the vegetation did more than just look pretty. God knows how to make anything look beautiful, since He loves beautiful things.

He's like an artist, and can make each thing that is



useful and needed look wonderful, colourful, and perfect.

Trees, grass, plants, and all sorts of greenery would provide food, shade, and shelter for the people and animals He was about to create.

What kinds of food did He make? Fresh, juicy fruits like oranges, mangos, pineapples, watermelons, and strawberries. Crunchy coconuts, cashew nuts, walnuts and other nuts.

Grains like rice, corn, oats, wheat and many more. Beans of many types and colours. Vegetables of all sorts, like carrots, beets, cucumbers, tomatoes, lettuce, zucchini, bell peppers and countless others. He made food that grew rich and full of the nutrients and vitamins that Earth's new inhabitants would need.

There was still something to do before man and animals could live there, though. (We'll learn about that in our next story!)

Activity

Activity					
Verses: Matthew 5:1-2 Do: Show pictures, postcards, calendar pictures and drawings of mountains. Learn the names of a few famous mountains or mountain ranges. Look on maps or a globe and show where they are located.					
Verse: Matthew 5:3 Do: Say which words below describe some of Jesus' disciples, as the Bible has told us they were, and what were they not:

Verse: Matthew 5:4

Do: Has anyone you know gone to be with the Lord? What's something they might be glad about now, in heaven?

Verse: Matthew 5:5

Do: Take turns naming countries that are suffering in some way because of the selfishness, greed, fear or pride of other countries, and then pray for the people living there.

Verse: Matthew 5:6

Do: Read and act out the "Parable of the Sower". (See Matthew 13 for selected verses.)

Verse: Matthew 5:7

Do: Look up and write out simple definitions to the words "obtain" and "mercy". Forgive anyone who has wronged you whom you might still be holding a grudge towards.

Verse: Matthew 5:8

Do: Read the verses: "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me: But verily God hath heard me; he hath attended to the voice of my prayer" (Psalm 66:18,19). Pray silently for the Lord's forgiveness for something that you are feeling bad about, something that is in your heart that only He knows.

Verse: Matthew 5:9

Do: Pick names of different people in your home or family or class. Without saying the name, but only by telling some way they help to make things better for others, try to have the others guess who you are thinking of. Remember the good things said, and repeat them to the person when you can. "We were saying how nice it is that you _____" or "So and so said today that they like how you "

Verse: Matthew 5:10

Do: For fun, learn to spell "righteousness".

Verse: Matthew 5:11-12

Do: Draw a picture of a reward you are looking forward to in heaven, for being faithful to Jesus now.

Verse: Matthew 5:13

Do: Explore salt. Find out how important salt is, and some of its many uses. Why is the sea salty? Where does salt come from? Talk about how specific foods or snacks would really taste different if there wasn't any salt added? Do a taste check to find the difference it makes to add salt to different foods like a tomato or an avocado. What does salt do to help prepare olives?

Verse: Matthew 5:14-15

Do: Try an experiment. Light a candle and put a jar over it. See how long the air lasts and when the flame goes out.

Verse: Matthew 5:16

Do: Draw or write some ways that members of your family "shine"—qualities or talents the Lord gave them, which are used for good. Quote or read the Bible verse: "And they that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament; and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever" (Daniel 12:3).

Psalm 43:3 O send out thy light and thy truth: let them lead me; let them bring me unto thy holy hill, and to thy tabernacles.


Psalm 139:11 If I say, Surely the darkness shall cover me; even the night shall be light about me.
