On this day He started with the fish and sea creatures, then created birds of all types. These were the first animals created.

God told these first birds and fish and all the creatures that lived in water to "multiply"—that means to make more! God wanted more and more of

them to fill the sea, the air and the trees.

He liked to see the happy creatures having fun in His new world. He enjoyed hearing the songs of the birds, and the sounds of many sea creatures too—sounds you seldom know about or rarely hear.

He liked seeing the fish exploring the pathways of the seas and rivers, discovering all that they do down there.

It was marvellous to Him. God liked them all, and was ready to do the same with the land—fill it with life!





On the sixth day God added lots more! He created many types of animals on the Earth: animals that would walk, crawl, hop, leap, climb, gallop, hang, jump, glide, wiggle, creep, stand, trot, fly, dig, run, and so forth.



1:24 And God said, Let the earth bring forth the living creature after

his kind, cattle, and creeping thing, and beast of the earth after his kind; and it was so.

1:25 And God made the beast of the earth after his kind, and cattle after their kind, and every thing that creepeth upon the earth after his kind: and God saw that it was good.

1:30 And to every beast of the earth, and to every fowl of the air, and to every thing that creepeth upon the earth, wherein there is life, I have given every green herb for meat: and it was so.

1:31 And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was very good. And the evening and the morning were the sixth day.

Praise

Psalm 18:3a I will call upon the Lord, who is worthy to be praised.

*Think for a moment about all the people around the world who are praising God. If you were to hear them all at once, it would be too hard to make out what they were saying, but the Lord knows and hears each one as if they were the only one praising. Now all talk at once, saying aloud as many things as you can think of that you are glad for—all at the same time!

In Paul's letter to the believers in Philippi, he spoke of a man named Epaphroditus. Paul said good things about him and called him "my brother, and companion in labour". There were many new groups of believers in different places, as Paul travelled and took the good news of salvation to as many people as he could.

There were those who believed needed encouragement, instruction, and God's Word, as they built their new lives of faith. Paul couldn't personally visit each one as often as he would like, so others helped him to visit them and sometimes brought a letter from Paul to the group of believers in that city. Epaphroditus was sent by Paul, as this passage mentions.

Philippians

- 2:19 But I trust in the Lord Jesus to send Timotheus shortly unto you, that I also may be of good comfort, when I know your state.
- 2:20 For I have no man likeminded, who will naturally care for your state.
 - 2:21 For all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's.
- 2:22 But ye know the proof of him, that, as a son with the father, he hath served with me in the gospel.
- 2:23 Him therefore I hope to send presently, so soon as I shall see how it will go with me.
 - 2:24 But I trust in the Lord that I also myself shall come shortly.
- 2:25 Yet I supposed it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus, my brother, and companion in labour, and fellowsoldier, but your messenger, and he that ministered to my wants.
- 2:26 For he longed after you all, and was full of heaviness, because that ye had heard that he had been sick.
- 2:27 For indeed he was sick nigh unto death: but God had mercy on him; and not on him only, but on me also, lest I should have sorrow upon sorrow.
- 2:28 I sent him therefore the more carefully, that, when ye see him again, ye may rejoice, and that I may be the less sorrowful.
- 2:29 Receive him therefore in the Lord with all gladness; and hold such in reputation:
- 2:30 Because for the work of Christ he was nigh unto death, not regarding his life, to supply your lack of service toward me.

*Epaphroditus did all he could for the Lord, using all his strength and time to bring God's love and message to others. See how many different good words you can make using the letters in his name.

of the field: the wild asses quench their thirst. By them shall the fowls of the heaven have their habitation, which sing among the branches.

Psalm 104:13,14 He watereth the hills from his chambers: the earth is satisfied with the fruit of thy works. He causeth the grass to grow for the cattle, and herb for the service of man: that he may bring forth food out of the earth.

Psalm 147:7-9 Sing unto the Lord with thanksgiving; sing praise upon the harp unto our God: Who covereth the heaven with clouds, who prepareth rain for the earth, who maketh grass to grow upon the mountains. He giveth to the beast his food, and to the young ravens which cry.

Isaiah 43:20 The beast of the field shall honour me, the dragons and the owls: because I give waters in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert, to give drink to my people, my chosen.

Psalm 145:15 The eyes of all wait upon thee; and thou givest them their meat in due season.

Psalm 145:16 Thou openest thine hand, and satisfiest the desire of every living thing.

Matthew 6:26 Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are ye not much better than they?
