
\*Do you know what "gravity" is? The sun keeps all the planets close to it with its gravity.

 Use a long pair of tights or a skipping rope, and attach it to a ball or balloon. Now, spin it out and around you. It's going around you, while you stay in the centre. But it doesn't fly off around the room or yard. It stays around you, as it you are holding and pulling it to you.

That's like the sun in the centre of the solar system, with the planets around it. They go around, but always stay a certain distance away. The sun's gravity is keeping them around, just like an invisible rope or pull on them.

Earth also has gravity! Things are kept on the ground.

o Gather some things that won't break. Drop them where they can safely land. Do the items fly up, or do they fall down, towards the ground? Gravity makes them do that! It's an invisible pull, pulling everything to the Farth's surface.

There are **7 days** in a week.


There are 4 weeks in a month.
