




God Creates the Universe

God made some lights in the sky, so


the Earth could have what it needs.

He created the Sun to




shine and light up the day, and the Moon to shine at night.

Some jobs of the Sun

Draw something to illustrate the points.

The sun evaporates water changing it into clouds. The rain can water the land and plants, to keep them growing.

Extra water runs into the rivers, lakes, stream and ocean. And it just keeps going. A big water cleaning-and-spraying machine is what the sun helps to run.

Sunlight helps the plants to make the food they need to keep themselves growing.

We can then enjoy edible plants and parts of plants for our food as well.



The sun and Earth are just at the right distance

away from each other to keep the Earth at the temperature that humans can live on it.

Nature can experience seasons throughout the year,

depending on which part of the Earth is closest or the furthest away from the sun; which part is tilting towards the sun or tilting away from it.

The centre of the Earth—at a place that is called the "equator" which sounds a bit like

"equal" as it's the middle of the Earth between the top and bottom halves of the Earth—is nearly always warm, and doesn't



have cold winters. It is the closest part of the world to the sun, all the time, as it's in the widest part of the globe, and sticks out closer to the sun.
