


1.) God Creates the Earth

God created the Earth and all the beautiful places in it. First He created the light.


"Let there be light", He said, and then there was light!



Next, God spoke and created the sky and air around the world. He separated the water, leaving some below on the Earth, and placing some way up above.






2.) God Creates the Universe

God made some lights in the sky, so the Earth could have what it needs.


He created the sun to shine and light up the day, and the moon to shine at night. The sun helps plants to grow and keeps the Earth warm.



God also added stars and planets in the space surrounding the Earth—a whole universe!




God created and placed everything just right so that Earth would be a great place to live.




3.) Animals Are Made



4.) The First Man on Earth


The world was a beautiful place to be, and ready for the first human beings. God then used some soil from the ground to do the most amazing thing. Out of the dirt He made a man!

God knew he needed a friend, a person to live with, talk to, and to be a companion for him. So after putting Adam to sleep, God prepared a special friend for him.




When Adam woke up, he saw what God had made—a woman! Adam was very happy. He loved her and called her "Eve". She was the world's very first woman.

God liked watching all the neat and cool things that His creation could do! He saw the funny animals at play, the pretty sunsets, the birds in the trees and sky, singing their songs.



God saw all that He'd made, and said it was good! God took time to stop and look and listen and enjoy it all. He took a day to rest.


We can and should do the same—take time to rest, to talk with God, to enjoy nature, to laugh.

God wanted to make a really special place, a garden for Adam and Eve to live in and have all that they needed.




God created a place called "The Garden of Eden" and there He put the first people He'd made. It was such a wonderful place to be.






Many years ago, people would live much longer than they do now. Methuselah's father was Enoch. He loved God very much, and tried to do what God wanted him to do.

Enoch loved having time talking with God more than doing anything else, so one day God took Enoch up to live with Him, away from all the bad things going on in the world.




10.) A Good Man for a Great Job

Noah loved God and obeyed Him. God told him to build a big, strong boat, and to load it with animals and plenty of supplies.




It was going to be a long trip. God would wash the world with the flood, but in the ark, the big boat, they would be safe and dry.



11.) Rain and a Rainbow



When at last it was dry enough on Earth, they could all go out again. Noah and his family were so glad to be out of the ark, and glad the world was all new and nice again.




God then put a beautiful rainbow in the sky, as a promise that the great worldwide flood would never happen again.




12.) The Tower of Babel




Since no one could understand most of the others anymore, as they could before, they had to stop building the tall tower, and instead went to explore new places on Earth and do new things.




13.) A Man on the Move




Abraham and his team had to walk or travel on camels or other animals, or wagons. He had many animals. Abraham chose to obey.

Abraham had a wife called Sarah, and God said that one day she would have a child. They looked forward to the day when this would happen. It took faith and patience to wait.




14.) Living Peacefully

Abraham was a kind and generous man.


One time when there wasn't enough grass for all the sheep, goats, and other animals to graze on, the shepherds wondered what to do.

Abraham suggested that Lot choose whatever new area he'd like to move to, so his flocks and herds could get all that they needed.




Lot was given first choice, and he chose the best place he could find, and moved there. Abraham was glad to make Lot and his team happy and to bring peace.




Isaac let others have his own well, and he moved and worked hard to dig another one.

As he was travelling, God did a wonderful thing to encourage him. Jacob had a beautiful dream of angels on a heavenly ladder.




He knew God was there right beside him, and loved him and would help him. Jacob chose to change and follow God's way instead, and God took good care of him.




20.) Hard Work and a Family of His Own


Jacob tried to keep being faithful to work hard and care for his family. God told him it was finally time to move back to his country.


Jacob knew it was only God who had given him all that he now had. Esau gave him a hug and showed him forgiveness. They became friends again.




22.) Comparing and Coats

God was preparing him to do something that would be a great help to his brothers and father and family.




23.) Joseph in Egypt

Joseph was then put in charge of storing up food during the plentiful years. Pharaoh made him one of the most important men in Egypt so he could do this special job.




24.) Food in Egypt




Joseph then told his brothers who he was, and hugged them. They were glad Joseph forgave them for not treating him nicely before.




One day, a baby was sleeping in a little basket-bed-boat, floating near the edge of the river. His older sister was watching over him.




Then Pharaoh's daughter saw the little baby and picked him up. She heard him cry, and loved him. She called him Moses.

They had faith that it was all going to work out, if they prayed and listened to God and did whatever He told them to do.




28.) Woeful and Wonderful


The Israelites were free to leave and move to where God wanted them to go. It was a very big move, and they got going right away, bringing all their animals and belongings.

In front of them was the Red Sea, and they needed to cross it.



The Israelites were so glad for the miracle that God had done. They praised God and sang songs to Him!




30.) Wilderness, Water, and Wells

However, the water tasted bad!




The people started to grumble. But does that help to bring a solution? No!


Moses prayed and asked God what to do.



God said He'd bring water out of a rock! Moses hit the rock, and water came pouring out! All the people and animals had water to drink.






33.) A Blazing Mountain, a Blasting Trumpet, and Tablets of Stone

Moses told the people everything God had said. Later, while Moses was again with God on the mountain, God wrote on tablets of stone some of the rules, for the people to easily remember and follow.




These were called "The Ten Commandments." There were many things God said, and lots of instructions were also written down on scrolls to be read and remembered.

God had given instructions to the people of Israel, but they didn't follow them well. Moses was very upset, and God was displeased too.


The people were sorry for their wrongdoings, and God forgave those who wanted to make the right choices and follow Him.

When Moses came down from the mountain after this special time with the Lord, his face was very bright and was shining! Everyone knew that he had spent time talking to God.




35.) The Cloud of the Lord


37.) Joshua, Jordan, and Jericho

Joshua became the new leader of the big team of people who were ready to enter into their new country. God told Joshua what to do, and how to enter the new land.




The priests carried the Ark of the Covenant to the Jordan River and as soon as their feet touched the water, God parted it and made a pathway through the water.


They walked across on dry land.



Next, a team of people and priests marched around the big high walls of the city of Jericho, once a day for six days and then seven times on the seventh day.






38.) Gideon and the Angel

God promised that things would be nice again in the land of Israel, if they continued to obey and follow Him.




40.) A Strong Man

41.) Kind Ruth






She had waited so long to have a child, and it made her very glad that God had answered her prayer and gave her a baby.

Each year when Hannah and her husband Elkanah visited, she brought Samuel a nice new coat that she had made. The coat would fit him and keep him warm for the next year.





Samuel was a good example. He read and studied God's Word and then put it into action. People began to listen to what Samuel said and to follow what he told them from the Lord.




Samuel prayed for them. He told them to love and obey God most of all, and then things would get better for them—and that's just what happened!

The country began to be a better place, as the people obeyed God's Words.






Saul met some people who gave him bread, and also prophets with instruments. When Saul met them, amazingly he prophesied along with them.

God told the people, and King Saul, that they needed to follow His Words and be obedient to Him if they wanted things to go well in their country.




