The show displayed scenes of the best and most amazing, firework displays from different celebrations.


It was all put to music as well. The light explosions would go right in time with the beat and style of the music.

"Sure thing!" Jesus replied. You here in Heaven can watch on your 3D screen. It will be a great show!"


"Come, I have something else to show you!" Jesus said, and off they zoomed.
