



David became the next king after Saul.



King David was kept safe because he liked to listen to God's Words and would obey whatever God said to do. He wanted to make the Lord happy most of all!




53.) Instructions and Supplies for Solomon



Many people would be needed to help build it, and people were willing and very happy to help.


King Solomon sat on the throne and was in charge of leading the country, as well as the big temple building project.




55.) A Wise King




Elijah was going to have a long trip, and he needed this special angel food to give him the strength to travel. He walked, ran, and travelled for 40 days, and didn't even get hungry!

The special bread from the angel gave him lots of energy.




When he arrived at his new place, he stayed in a cave. God talked with him and encouraged him. Then he travelled onward to continue doing the jobs that God wanted him to do.




60.) The Boys Who Were Kings





One man was using an axe, and the axe head suddenly flew off and fell into the river.





God blessed the king for making the right choice to love and obey Him.




One time, when he had a meeting with some other kings, there wasn't any water for the big crowd of people and their animals to drink.






76.) Ezekiel the Prophet




The Lord and His angels need people on Earth to be God's helpers, and to pass on His Words. His angels will help you to do the job.

Jeremiah was a prophet who told people of the troubles that would come if they didn't listen to God, follow His instructions, and choose to do what God said was best.




He didn't feel like he was old enough, or very important, or smart. Jeremiah didn't know what to say to the people, but God told him what to do and say, and he told people God's Words.




The people were sad to have to leave their country and their homes, and sorry that they hadn't listened and obeyed God's Words.

81.) Wise Young Men






This helped them to grow strong and healthy, and to look handsome. These young men impressed the king with their wise answers to his questions, so he chose them to be his advisers and helpers.




82.) Job's Lessons



84.) King Cyrus and King Darius



There was a man called Ezra who knew God's Word real well. He was a scribe, and he was given an important job. The king told Ezra to go and be a teacher to all the people.



Ezra prayed a lot, and received the Lord's help. He faithfully taught people what God's Word said.




86.) Nehemiah


Nehemiah had faith that with God, prayer, and a hardworking faithful team of helpers, he could rebuild the big long wall around the whole city of Jerusalem.


87.) Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi

The Words from God came to the prophets. They wrote them down, and told everyone the tips and counsel on how to have a happy life.


When people were doing the wrong things, God told them that troubles would come to them, to teach them to do things God's better way.


88.) Mary and the Angel

A young lady named Mary was chosen by God to be the mother of a very special child—someone who would come to Earth and show people God's love.




An important messenger was sent from God to tell Mary about the baby God was giving her.




89.) Baby John


The Archangel Gabriel appeared to a priest called Zacharias when he was praying, and told him that he and his wife Elizabeth would finally have a baby, and he would be named John.






Around the time when Baby Jesus would be born, a law was made that everyone was to return to their home town to pay taxes and be counted.

The Ruler wanted to know how many people lived in the country. So Joseph and Mary had to travel to Bethlehem.



Everyone was amazed to hear about it.




93.) A Star and Gifts

94.) Simeon and Anna






It was a very special time for both of these faithful people. They had waited so long for Jesus to bring God's love to Earth, and at last He had come.

96.) John and Jesus


When John the Baptist was ready to start his job for God, he went to live in the wilderness near the Jordan River. He told everyone that it was time to prepare for the coming of Jesus.

Jesus and His disciples, as well as His mother Mary, were invited to a wedding. At the party, wine was served as part of the treats for the adults.






99.) Fishermen
