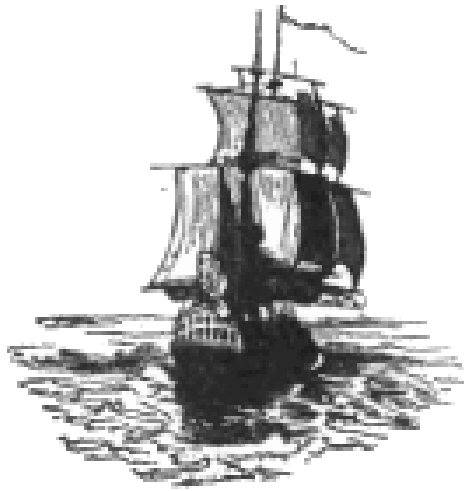

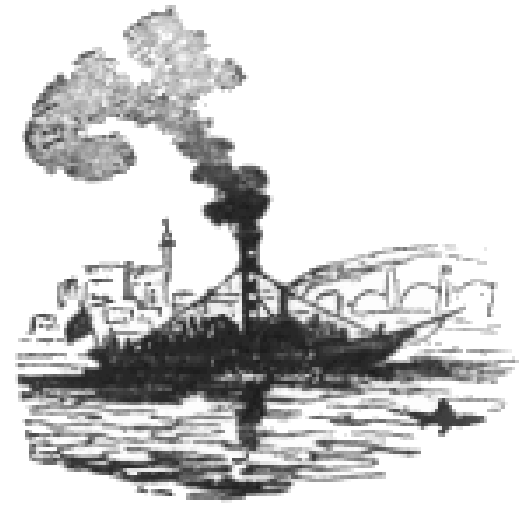

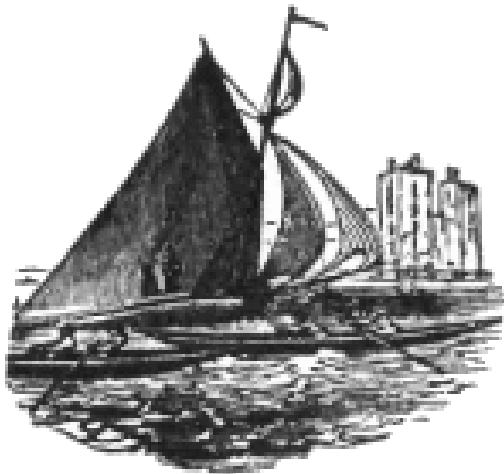

These boats are going fast.



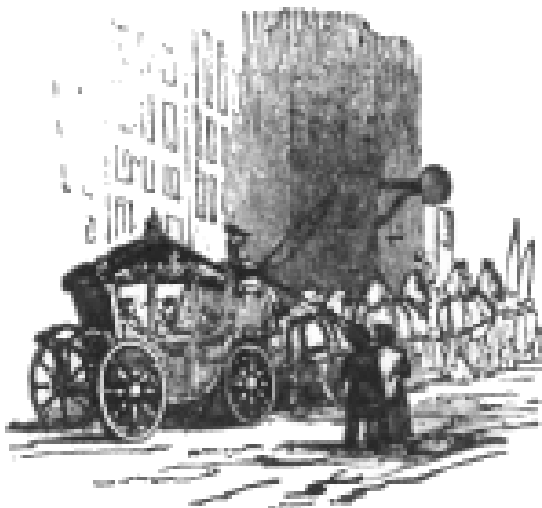
Here is a coal-barge.

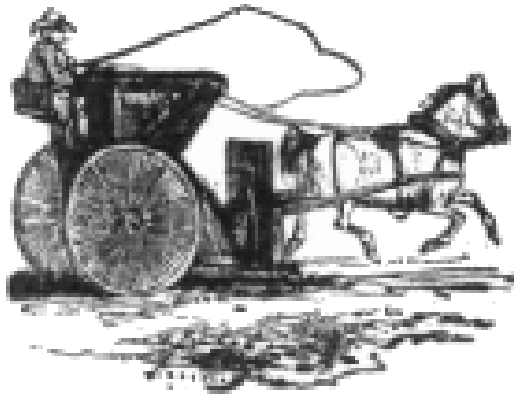

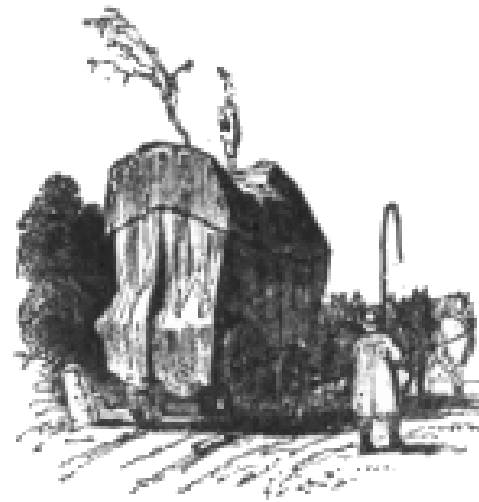

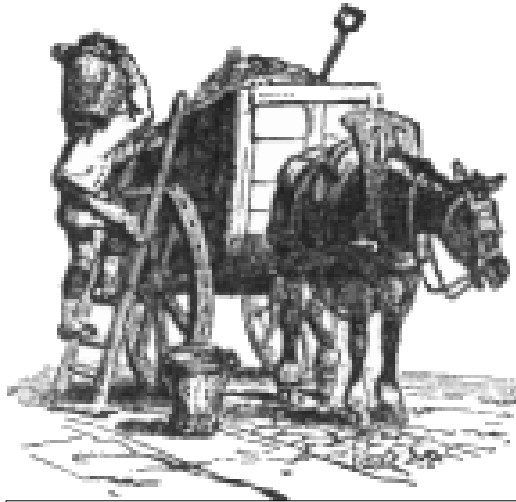

Buy my strawberries!



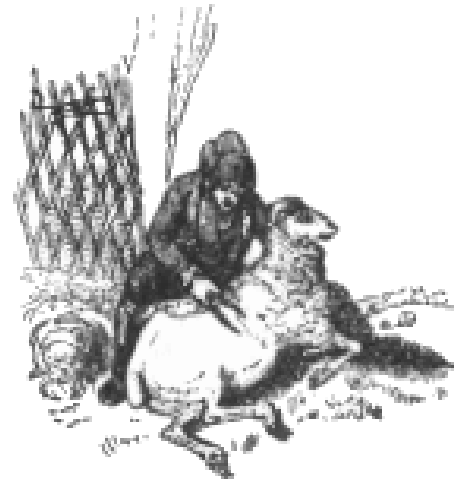

Betty milks the cow while John cuts down trees.



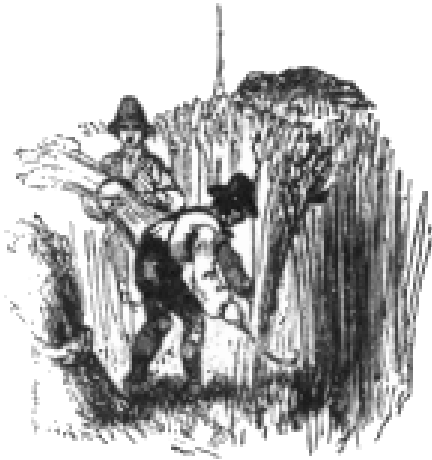
